

## **Spraying silage or hay with Roundup TRANSORB<sup>®</sup> before cutting**

Great news! **Roundup TRANSORB** now has a new label claim making it unique against ordinary glyphosate products, as it's the only one in New Zealand that is registered for application prior to cutting hay or silage.

Normally farmers would need to wait at least 2-3 weeks after cutting before there is sufficient leaf re-growth to spray with **Roundup TRANSORB** if the paddock is going into new pasture or a crop. The limitations of this method are many: increased soil moisture losses, reduced weed control and crops planted later.

By applying **Roundup TRANSORB** before the silage/hay is cut it allows for the immediate establishment of a new pasture or crop – that's 3 weeks saved, which is a great benefit to farmers at a busy time of year. There are numerous other benefits too: reduces paddock down time, wilting time is reduced, weed control can be improved and the carbohydrate levels (ME) in sprayed pasture/cereal are usually enhanced, improving digestibility and silage quality.
